Christmas Concert

On Tuesday 10th December, the NLC Christmas Concert 2024, run by the KS5 Music Academy, took place for both local Junior School's on the Tuesday morning, and for parents on the Tuesday evening. Familiar faces were present along with new, bright faces ready to perform for the very first time! Performances included the Steel band, Rock bands, Wind band, and Year 10,11, 12 & 13 class bands. Even the teachers joined in with a rendition of Merry Christmas Everyone! This year was special as it was Head of School Mrs. Johnson's first Christmas Concert at NLC. She was so proud of all the students that took part, performed and helped run it. Ms. Turnbull was extremely proud of her department again for organising and performing in this concert. All the students have made so much progress and many will be back next year. In the meantime we look forward to Battle of the Bands in February 2025 and Back to the 80's this year's musical in March 2025.

Wear it yellow

Mrs. Hymanforth and the Mental Health Ambassadors organised a school wide event to celebrate "Wear it Yellow" day, highlighting the importance of mental health and wellbeing throughout our school community. £250 was raised for mental health charities.

We celebrated Children in Need this year by holding a bake sale at break time. £280 was raised from this amazing event organised by Mrs. Smith.

Attendance trip

At the end of half term, our best attending students in year 8 and 9 were invited to take part in 'Generation Green': a 2-night residential trip to the countryside, to celebrate their resilience and excellent attendance and punctuality record.

The trip involved a lot of time spent outdoors and in woodland areas, where the students learned to make dens, build fires, take part in nature walks and even create natural art. There was also an opportunity to literally hug trees, which Mr. Kirk was very enthusiastic about, and one pupil befriended a goat! All students took part in the activities with interest, with many even saying that the whole day walk was their favourite! It was also generally agreed that the food provided was amazing, with the hash browns at breakfast getting the biggest shout out. The staff at the centre remarked on the beautiful manners and behaviour of our young people, which made us (and I'm sure their parents) very proud indeed.

Royal Armouries Trip

Students took part in an engaging trench warfare workshop and discovered what it would be like to train with the military. The students were a real credit to NLC.

Reminder of Equipment & Uniform requirements

We want every pupil to start the day in a positive way with correct uniform and equipment.

It is vital that your child has the correct equipment every day for school so that they are Ready to Learn from minute one of the lesson. The basic equipment of a Bag, Black pen, Red pen & Ruler has been extended to having a refillable water bottle. We no longer provide plastic cups, but do still provide water fountains where your child can fill up their reusable water bottle at break and lunch time to last them through the day.

Mobile phones in school

A reminder that mobile phones should be 'off and away' at all times, any phone seen or heard will be confiscated; this includes confiscating students' phones from them if they make contact home during the school day and the school office is contacted by parents as a result of this. If your child becomes unwell in school they should contact a member of the first aid team or student services who will contact home. Phones that are confiscated will be returned to students at the end of the day in the first instance, should there be a second occurrence a text will be sent home with the requirement for a parent/carer to collect the phone on their child's behalf. The restriction is in place at all times while students are in the grounds of the school building, this includes when students arrive and leave at the end of the day. Phones should be away before students enter the school grounds and not accessed until they have left the site. Should students wish to use their phone at the end of the day to contact parents with any concerns or for collection following school based activities they are asked to use the main reception area of the school where a student phone is available to contact home.

Attendance

One of our key focuses remains raising attendance at NLC and Autumn Term has shown a significant increase on last year's attendance for the same period. A particular shout out to Year 11, who have increased their attendance by over 3.5% for the same time period last year!! We appreciate your work at home in motivating your young people and getting them in to school.

Being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. Evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results.

Arbor Parent App will be replacing SIMs Parent App from January 2025. Parents and carers will receive an email from Arbor asking you to login and then download the Arbor Parent App. We will be using the App for communicating information and reports so it is vital your download it as soon as you receive the welcoming email.
