**English**

We will focus on developing our reading and SPaG skills to ensure we are confident in answering different types of questions and analysing texts. We will be using our CLICK topic as inspiration for our writing. Our novel study this half term is 'Wonder' and we are looking forward to developing our understanding of ways to change our perceptions of the differences between people.

**Maths**

We will continue to develop our understanding of place value and we will be investigating the use of the four operations in a wide range of problems and reasoning contexts. We will look at inverse operations and linked problems which will require us to develop our mathematical understanding.

**PHSE**

In our Jigsaw lessons, we will focus on being us in our world. We will explore who can help us and where we can get help. We will also explore where we as individuals fit into wider society and how our lives compare to the lives of others in different communities.

**CLICK**

In CLICK this half term we will be learning all about the Wonders of the World, this will include the ancient man-made wonders of the world as well as the modern wonders and the natural wonders. This topic will allow us to develop our geographical knowledge of the world using our map skills and develop our understanding of the world's biomes and climates. <b>Chichen Itza</b>	Large city in Mayan civilisation.
<b>The Colosseum</b>	Ancient amphitheatre built by the Romans.
<b>Petra</b>	Ancient city in Jordan.
<b>Machu Picchu</b>	Ancient Inca fortress in the Andes mountains.
<b>Taj Mahal</b>	A marble mausoleum in India.
<b>The Great Wall of China</b>	A fortification system to protect China's northern borders.
<b>Christ the Redeemer</b>	Statue of Jesus Christ in Rio D'Janeiro, Brazil
<b>Equator</b>	A line notionally drawn around the Earth from the poles
<b>Tropic of Cancer</b>	The parallel of latitude that is north of the equator
<b>Tropic of Capricorn</b>	The parallel of latitude that is south of the equator
<b>Hemisphere</b>	A half of a sphere or the Earth, divided into Northern and Southern by the equator
<b>Longitude</b>	The lines running vertically around the Earth
<b>Latitude</b>	Angular distance is measured from the equator
<b>Biome</b>	A large naturally occurring community of flora and fauna in a habitat
<b>Climate</b>	The weather conditions prevailing in an area in general.
