Year 4 Spring 2 2025 Why is Huddersfield a cool place to live?

English

Our English focus this half term will be narrative. We will read the text 'The Train to Impossible Places' - developing our reading skills by answering VIPERS questions, learning how to retrieve evidence in writing and form a written answer. We will also use the story as inspiration for our writing

Maths

We will be consolidating skills in and gain further confidence with using formal written methods for the multiplying and dividing (using estimation and inverse to check the answers to our calculations). We will also start to look at fractions.

Science

We will study and investigate classifying and grouping living things. We will also be studying endangered animals.

Key Vocabulary	
Amphibians	A cold-blooded vertebrate animal that has gills and usually lives near water. For example: frogs, newts and salamanders.
Birds	A warm-blooded vertebrate animal that lays eggs, has wings and usually feathers. For example: a parrot and an eagle.
Classification	Arranging animals/plants into groups according to their similarities and differences.
Fish	A cold-blooded vertebrate animal with gills and fins who live mostly in water. For example: a pike, goldfish and sea bass.
Habitat	The natural home or environemtn of an animal, plant, or oter organism.
Insects	A small six-legged animal that has an exoskeleton. This means they have a hard shell-like covering on the outside of their bodies.
Invertebrate	An animal lacking a backbone.
Mammals	A warm-blooded vertebrate animal that has hair or fur and gives birth to live young. For example: monkeys, whales and humans.
Reptiles	A vertebrate animal that includes snakes, lizards and turtles. They have dry, scaly skin and lay eggs on land.
Skeleton	The bone structure that protects the internal organs of living things.
Vertebrate	An animal with a backbone.
